I am writing to object to the proposed boundary changes to the Corangamite and Wannon electoral boundaries.

My family arrived in Lorne in 1875. I was born in Lorne, was educated in Lorne then Geelong and the Melbourne University. I was the principal of the Lorne/Aireys Inlet P-12 College from 1990 until 1997. I have returned to live in Lorne after my retirement. I have been involved in leadership positions in the community over the past eight years and have a strong interest in the operations of local government.

My background has given me a deep understanding of the nature of our community and that of Aireys Inlet and Anglesea. Although disparate in some ways we have a common passion for our region, our heritage and our future.
