Dear Members of the AEC Redistribution Committee: Mr Tom Rogers, Mr Steve Kennedy, Mr Craig Sandy and Mr Andrew Greaves

Re: Naming of the proposed new federal electorate in Victoria.

I write regarding the above and submit below a list of notable women worthy of having a federal electorate named after them.

Only 5 of the 38 Federal Electoral Divisions in Victoria, 13%, are named after women. Therefore, the new electorate needs to be named after a woman to re-dress this imbalance, particularly as more than half of Australia's population are women.
