In terms of an AEC on record response in addition to our media statement yesterday, this follows below:

Acting Electoral Commissioner, Tom Rogers said to a Joint Standing Committee on Electoral Committee (31 July):

"I have also made the decision to establish an electoral integrity unit, which will be focused on ensuring the integrity of all of our electoral processes not just those implemented during the election period itself. As you know, we have introduced some significant new processes with enrolment over the past two years.....I am keen to proactively consider the integrity of our enrolment processes and to provide ourselves with additional assurances that they are robust and dependable, and in line with our drive on integrity. This will be the electoral integrity unit's first task."

Mr Rogers has said publicly that this is part of a process of stress testing every aspect of the AEC's operations.

Hedley, going to your question seeking information about the AEC's activities re further work in Indi, the Acting Electoral Commissioner has said that due to the fact that the AEC has referred 27 matters to the AFP, we cannot comment on the record about anything which may compromise the ongoing work of the AEC, nor the AFP given the referral that has occurred.

You will have to draw your own conclusions from this but the AEC cannot comment for the reason given above.

Mr Rogers also reiterated that he is happy to meet you next Wednesday while he is Brisbane on a strictly off the record basis. If you would like to avail of this opportunity with him could you please indicate by first thing Tuesday if you would like this meeting to go ahead.
