Mr Fearn read and accepted the report. He raised concern at our determination of the associated entities that we identified and will answer our request for a return when obligation letters are issued by the Director to the financial controllers.

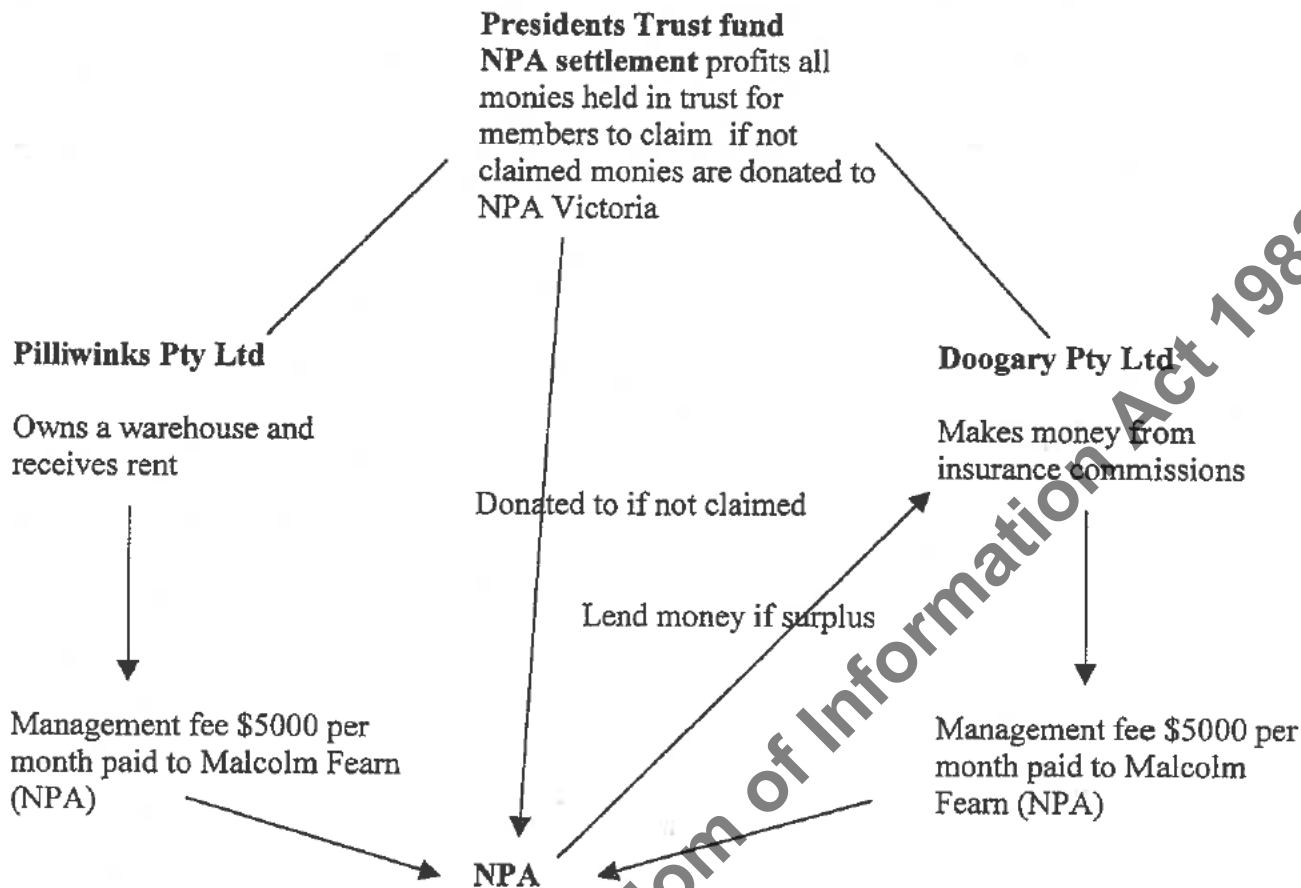
Those identified as associated entities were

- Doogary Proprietary Limited ACN 005828606;
- Pilliwinks Proprietary Limited ACN 005398381
- Presidents Trust for the NPA Vic Settlement, and the
- Triple A Luncheon Trust.

Mr Fearn said that they were not associated entities because everything is like a fountain in reverse.

He then drew a diagram to illustrate this point.



Money is passed on to the Party as a donation by members of the party if they do not claim the dividend between 1/7 to 31/8.

Further notes not discussed

Simplistic view is that receipts from Pilliwinks and Doogary on the return do not indicate the source.

Donations (even though they are not as claimed by Mr Fearn) could be hidden by donors giving monies to either Pilliwinks or Doogary who then give to party.

Triple A Luncheon Trust is a fund-raising vehicle similar to Liberal party's 200 & 500 clubs. (the consultant accountant, Mr Brock, had offered this analogy to us)!

We were convinced that whilst the arguments presented by Mr Fearn in that the revenue generated by these entities belonged to the members, the entities were being used as a vehicle or conduit for channelling money to the Party.
