The Pastoral Council of St Mary's Catholic Church in Bairnsdale are wanting to lodge an objection to the proposed name change for the Seat of McMillan to become the Seat of Monash. Although Sir John Monash is a very credible Australian citizen his connection to Gippsland is limited so we do not agree with the renaming to Seat of Monash.

We feel very strongly that changing the name from Seat of McMillan is vital as Angus McMillan has been confirmed as being involved in the removal of Aboriginal culture and massacres of many aboriginal men, women and children.

We believe that the renaming the electoral area, Seat of Bunjileene-Purrinee is appropriate as the Gunaikurnai people are the ancestors of our area. The renaming would also help towards healing the hurts of the past. If a cultural name is not to be used we continue to diminish the significance of the first peoples of our land and we are continuing the hurts. Our Gunaikurnai people have had to live with the insult of McMillian's name being honored. We believe changing the name to a culturally significant Ganaikurnai ancestor's name would be a major step towards saying sorry and a strong message of Reconciliation and education especially as we move towards Reconciliation week 2018.

The community of St Mary's Catholic Church Bairnsdale support the Parish Pastoral Council's recommendation that the seat is renamed to a culturally significant name to the Gippsland area.

We believe that this renaming will be a major step towards healing and reconciliation.
