Subject: Objections and Suggestions Regarding Proposed Electoral Boundaries

I am writing to submit my objections and suggestions regarding the proposed electoral boundaries affecting the Division of Kooyong, Chisholm, and Hotham. Based on the analysis of the documents provided by various political parties, I propose the following changes to better reflect community interests and geographic coherence.

1. Desire for Williams Road Boundary to Revert to Punt Road

The proposed boundary at Williams Road divides cohesive communities in Toorak and South Yarra, which share cultural, social, and economic ties. Reverting the boundary to Punt Road will better align these communities and enhance representation.

2. Request that Tooronga Road Boundary is Moved to Burke Road (Pushed Westward, Not East)

The current boundary at Tooronga Road arbitrarily divides communities with shared interests. Moving this boundary to Burke Road will better reflect the community structure and improve electoral representation. This suggestion is consistent with the Liberal Party's submission, which emphasizes aligning boundaries along natural demarcations and transport corridors.

3. Tooronga Road Boundary Moved to Kooyong Road (Pushed Westward)

The proposed boundary at Tooronga Road splits the Toorak and Malvern communities, which are demographically similar and share many community services. Adjusting the boundary to Kooyong Road will ensure these communities remain united within a single electorate, thus improving representation. This change is supported by submissions from both the Liberal Party and the Australian Greens.

These changes will enhance the coherence of the electoral boundaries, ensuring that communities with shared interests and characteristics are represented together.
