## Submission on the proposed Tasmanian redistribution details

**Category:** Names and Boundaries

**Details:** As a Northern Tasmanian I do not have strong thoughts on exactly how the new Southern boundaries should be made. However, reading some of the submissions, many are aggrieved about exact line drawing within the new boundaries.

What is clear is that there is no or little opposition to fixing the anomaly of Franklin's non-contiguous boundaries. The Commission rightly decided to correct this anomaly and it must, notwithstanding opposition about particular solutions, continue to pursue this goal.

I agree with the Break O'Day Council's submission that it remaining in Lyons is problematic. If an East Coast focussed electorate is to be created, it must include areas like St Helens and Scamander.

With regards to a new name, I support the retirement of Franklin. A name acknowledging a local Aboriginal person would be best, or in the alternative, a female political leader. I appreciate that Lyons is named after both the PM and Dame Enid Lyons, but it would be nice to have an electorate named solely after a woman.
